PUUANAHULU HOMESTEADS

LOT 40-B
(KAPALAOA SECTION)

Puuanahulu, North Kona, Hawaii, T. H.

Being a portion of the Government Land of Puuanahulu.

Beginning at a mound of stones at the south corner of this lot, and the southeast corner of Lot 39, Puuanahulu Homesteads, Kapalaoa Section (Homestead Lease 1 to John Alapai), the true azimuth and distance to an ancient monument known as "Ke Ahu o Lono" at the south corner of the land of Anaehoomalu, on the boundary between the districts of South Kohala and North Kona, about 150 feet west or makai of the Kiholo-Puako Trail being: $265^{\circ} 01' 50''$ 2313.3 feet, said monument being marked by a steel bolt in rock, the true azimuths and distances from said monument to Government Survey Triangulation Station "NCHONAOHAE" being $267^{\circ} 14'$ 69170.0 feet and to Government Survey Triangulation Station "PUULOLOA" being $217^{\circ} 49'$ 75353.0 feet, as shown on Government Survey Registered Map 1877, thence running by azimuths measured clockwise from True South:-

1. $164^{\circ} 05'$ 550.7 feet along Lot 39, Puuanahulu Homesteads, Kapalaoa Section (Homestead Lease 1 to John Alapai), to a "X" cut into bed rock by highwater mark at sea coast;
2. Thence along highwater mark at sea coast, the direct azimuth and distance being: $254^{\circ} 18' 30''$ 189.6 feet;
3. $308^{\circ} 00'$ 845.0 feet along Lot 40-A, Puuanahulu Homesteads, Kapalaoa Section;
4. $85^{\circ} 01' 50''$ 700.0 feet along remainder of the land of Puuanahulu to the point of beginning and containing an Area of 5.96 Acres.
