The following additional information is hereby provided as answers to questions submitted by potential bidders:

QUESTION 1:

- Will you take EGSA certification in place of that requirement as it has become pretty much the national standard for generator service issues?
- Would it be possible to recognize the EGSA certification of the technicians to perform work as a sufficient alternate to the contractor's license?

ANSWER:


- For maintenance and/or repair work on the generator or transfer switch, an EGSA certification will be allowed in lieu of an electrical contractor's license C-13 or C-15 or C-15B. **However**, for any work requiring contact with building wiring, the winning bidder must commit to using a subcontractor having a Hawaii electrical contractor's license. This is due to the stated examination contents on the EGSA website:
Testing covers Basic Electricity, Prime Movers, Generators/Alternators, Engine Generator Instrumentation and Controls, Governors, Automatic Transfer Switches, Voltage Regulators, Multiple Generator Switchgear & Controls, Auxiliary Support Systems, Startup/Commissioning, and Troubleshooting System Problems.
ICSD cannot identify a place where building codes or wiring to building power is covered. Therefore, they would have to have an electrician come out with them to do such work only when such work is needed.

QUESTION 2:

- Is the solicitation intended for Manufacture dealers specific to generators listed at each site?

ANSWER:

- No local vendor has been specified. Different generators and manufacturers are utilized at the various sites. So no specific local representative or statewide manufacturer has been specified. The requirement that vendors be certified by the manufacturer to work on the specific piece of equipment is deemed reasonable and the wording in section **4.0 Factory Certification, Training, and Tooling** of the IFB will not be modified.
