- 11/01/10 -- Akimeka personnel continues to monitor an open AT&T Mobility trouble ticket (11/21/09) for missing house number (HN), street and community information when transferring a WPH2 call or rebidding a WPH2 call. There have been no updates received to date.
- 11/01/10 -- Akimeka personnel continues to monitor the work with Telematics providers, OnStar, Ongoing Hughes, and ATX. There have been no updates or further testing scheduled by the Telematics providers.
- 11/01/10 -- Akimeka personnel continues to work on a flowchart for the Neighbor Island PSAPs which documents the flow of a Call Routing Spreadsheet (CRSS) and Testing Validation Worksheet (TVW).

It has been discovered that different processes exist among the carriers. The processes are being reviewed to ensure compliance to the ongoing wireless maintenance procedures as outlined by NENA.

- 11/01/10 --Akimeka personnel received and reviewed the CRS from Sprint-Nextel for their Nextel11/05/10towers. Responses to the questions were received from Jennie Stein.
- 11/01/10 -- Akimeka personnel participated in the monthly joint NENA/APCO Urgency Ongoing Algorithm/3rd Party EMD working group, Telematics committee, and data transfer conference calls. The committees are reviewing best practice procedures for EMD delivery by Telematics providers. Drafts are still under review by the committee.
- 11/18/10 --11/24/10 The use of the "Admin" telephone number for Sprint/Nextel's 9-1-1 overflow calls was not approved by the Hawai`i County PSAP. As such, Sprint/Nextel began the process to correct the routing of their 9-1-1 overflow calls by establishing a remote call forward (RCF) number via Hawaiian Telcom, Inc (HTI). The RCF number would be used in lieu of the "Admin" telephone number.

On behalf of the Hawai'i County PSAP, Akimeka coordinated and forwarded Hawai'i County's approval to Sprint/Nextel to establish a RCF number to the 9-1-1 network. Once Sprint/Nextel discovered that there would be non-recurring and recurring monthly charges, Sprint/Nextel needed to obtain the necessary internal approvals and authorization to proceed. The order was closed/cancelled at the request of HTI pending the acceptance of charges by Sprint/Nextel.

• **PSAP Operations** (continued)

11/29/10 -- Akimeka personnel assisted Lieutenant Wana in the investigation of a 9-1-1 caller complaint. The caller claimed that she did not place a call to 9-1-1.

In checking the PSAP's records, Dispatch received two (2) calls from the caller's wireless telephone number. A police officer called the wireless telephone number back and made arrangements to meet the caller at the location where the caller was. The alleged caller was adamant that she did not place a call to 9-1-1. As such, the officer checked her handset call log and no outbound calls to 9-1-1 were shown.

Trouble tickets were opened with both Hawaiian Telcom, Inc. (HTI) and AT&T Mobility to check their internal network logs for calls placed from the alleged caller's wireless telephone number. Both HTI and AT&T Mobility confirmed that two calls to 9-1-1 had been placed from the wireless telephone number in question.

Goldie Cross from AT&T Mobility agreed to handle the complaint and will be contacting the wireless subscriber to offer further assistance with her wireless services.

- 11/12/10 Akimeka completed the DRAFT North Kohala ESZ District Maps requested by Captain Miyamoto. An electronic pdf file was sent via email to to Captain Miyamoto and Lieutenant Wana for approval.
- 11/12/10 -- Akimeka started the effort to create new ESZ/ESN areas for the County of 11/24/10 Hawaii.
 - <u>Note:</u> Akimeka's dedicated circuit was not working and Akimeka's IT personnel was deployed to get this resolved. Once the connection is re-established and working, Akimeka will update the GIS server in the PSAP. The upload is targeted for mid-December 2010.
