**FOR THE KAUAI PROSECUTING ATTORNEY CANDIDATE
ELECTED TO OFFICE IN THE SPECIAL GENERAL ELECTION**

Pursuant to Act 97, signed into law on July 5, 2017, a candidate who is elected and is to be sworn into office prior to thirty days after the general election in which the candidate was elected, shall file the Final Election Period Report three business days before the date the candidate is to be sworn into office. The contest election deadline for the Kauai Prosecuting Attorney special general election is on March 18, 2022, so the elected candidate can be sworn in any time after that date.

(For candidate committees who filed the Organizational Report stating their intent to not receive contributions, or make expenditures, that aggregate more than \$1,000 in the election period for the Special Election.)

ALERT

At the conclusion of the Special General Election on February 26, 2022, candidate committees still registered with the Campaign Spending Commission (“Commission”) must continue to electronically file reports in the Candidate Filing System until their final disclosure report has no surplus or deficit, and a request to terminate is submitted to and approved by the Commission. The first report due after the Special General Election is the Supplemental Report covering the reporting period of February 27 through June 30, 2022, due on August 1, 2022, unless the candidate is running in the 2022 election then the applicable schedule must be followed for candidates that are running in the 2022 election.
