Beginning at the North angle, bearing S. $87^{\circ} 32'$ E. true, from the Hawaiian Govt. Survey Trig. Station "Naholowaa", distant 1443 ft., the ancient water hole called Kahala Puhiki bearing N. $14^{\circ} 50'$ E. true, distant 509 ft., as shown on Homestead Map 22 on file in the Government Survey Office, the boundary runs:-

1. S $4^{\circ} 10'$ W true 840 feet along the boundary of Waiakahiula L.C.A. 11216 to the South angle;
2. N $53^{\circ} 30'$ W true 445 feet to the West angle at upper road;
3. N $36^{\circ} 30'$ E true 715 feet along the upper road to the initial point, and containing an area of 3.65 acres.

3-- $N. 38^{\circ} 30' E.$ -true, 715 ft. along the upper road to the initial point, and containing an area of 3.65 acres
