Parade Theme:

“Ola Ke Aloha No Nā Ali‘i – The love for our Ali‘i lives on.”

Honoring the 100th anniversaries of the Hawaiian Civic Club of Honolulu (founding by Prince Jonah Kūhiō Kalaniana‘ole) and Hale O Nā Ali‘i (Originally established in 1886 as the Hale Nauā Scientific Society founded by King Kalākaua and then re-established on April 7, 1918 by a group of Hawaiian men and women.)

Parade Fee:

\$50 for commercial entries; \$25 for non-profit entries

Parade Route and Staging

- Building lot for floats will be in the Exhibition Hall of the Hawai‘i Convention Center (subject to change) and all other vehicles at Pier 11 at Aloha Tower Marketplace.
 - Details to be reviewed at General Parade Meeting.
- Parade will start at King and Richards Street fronting the ‘Iolani Palace
 - Floats and Decorated Vehicles, ‘Ewa on King Street and Bishop
 - Be mindful of Parade Starter
- Upon passing the statue of King Kamehameha I, you will not be allowed to stop for any reason.
 - Stopping will slow the rest of the Parade down.
 - We ask that tribute to the King be made on the move with song, chant or gesture. At no time should anyone break away from your unit to approach the statue.
 - Please consider paying your respects during the Statue Lei Draping Ceremony on June 8, 2018 at 3:00 p.m.
- Turning right onto Punchbowl, passing Kawaiaha‘o Church
 - Parade will marshal on Punchbowl to close gaps between units. Take direction from Parade staff.
- Left onto Ala Moana Boulevard
 - Please be mindful of traffic as Parade will cross over from the mauka lanes to the makai lanes to allow for cruise ship traffic.
- Right onto Kalākaua Avenue
- Parade will end at Kapi‘olani Park.
 - All Parade participants must adhere to City & County of Honolulu noise ordinances regarding the Honolulu Zoo.

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Parade Guidelines

- The primary focus of this floral Parade is to honor and celebrate the legacy and memory of King Kamehameha I, unifier of the Hawaiian Island. Regardless of Parade theme, please keep this in mind while preparing for and participating in the King Kamehameha Celebration Floral Parade.
- Each entry must be submitted on an official parade application. No application, no entry.
- Please list the order of vehicles for the Parade lineup if submitting more than one, including occupants. Changes will not be made after the lineup is set.
- Incumbent politicians are welcome, however must represent only that office. No campaigning allowed in Parade.
- Height of float not to exceed 15ft. due to overhanging stoplights.
- Magnetic signs must be adhered to each side of the vehicle with name and title of occupant(s).
 - A banner carried before the unit is an option.
- Parade Contact is responsible for making unit aware of and communicating all rules and regulations to, and understood by, the unit's participants.
- The Parade Committee will determine suitability of all entrants. All decisions are final. All entries are subject to the approval of the parade committee.

Parade Day Guidance

- All entries must remain in the order assigned by Staging Crew.
 - Absolutely no rearranging of unit or within the unit without explicit approval.
- We require that unit stay on the Parade route and keep pace with the parade lead.
- For yours and the crowd's safety, no distributing or throwing anything from your unit.
 - Watch for children along parade route.
- Parade begins at 9:00am, assembly start times vary.
- Stay hydrated throughout the parade route, and apply sunscreen prior to parade start.
- All participants must abide by the rules and regulations established by the Parade Committee.
- Drivers of vehicles must have good visibility from driver's seat.
 - Be mindful when decorating the hood of a vehicle. Safety first.
 - Also, to minimize gaps in the Parade, please allow one light pole to light pole length with unit in front at all times.
- Floats will be judged separately from Decorated Vehicles and Trolleys.
 - Judges will be positioned along the Parade route.
 - Judging to be based on creativity, originality and for capturing the theme.
- Parade will end at Kapi'olani Park.
 - No music or amplified noise beyond Kapahulu Avenue before the Honolulu Zoo, per City & County noise ordinance.
 - Dismantling of all floats, trolleys and decorated vehicles will take place at designated location to be shared at General parade meeting. Dumpsters for trash and green waste will be provided.
 - In addition to HPD, please abide by Parade Security direction and instruction.

The King Kamehameha Celebration Floral Parade Committee reserves the right of placement of all parade units. Placement will be determined by royal Hawaiian protocols, as well as for the most pleasant, safe, smooth-running parade possible.

- ✓ Narrative will be used for television broadcast and will be read at all Announcer Stands along the Parade route.
- ✓ **Due no later than MAY 1, 2018**, but may be turned in earlier; any narratives or changes to narratives received after this date are not guaranteed to be included in the overall Parade Script.
- ✓ **Keep in mind, this is meant to be short, concise and to the point as the unit will be moving while Narrative is being read by Parade Announcer.**

Parade Meeting:

Thursday, May 31, 2018 – Hawai'i State Capitol Auditorium (entrance in lower garage off Miller Street, past the Governor's mansion); **6:00 p.m. – 8:00 p.m.**, free parking available after 5:00 p.m. in metered stalls in the Capitol parking garage. **Meeting is mandatory for at least one representative per unit.**

Hawai'i Convention Center and Pier 11 schedules to be explained and reviewed at this time.

Information shared at meeting should be shared and relayed to your entire unit. Communication is key for a successful Parade.
