

RECORDS OF QUASI-JUDICIAL EXECUTIVE ACTIONS  
1856-1986

INTRODUCTION

The Records of Quasi-Judicial Executive Actions include Commutations of Sentence, Paroles, Pardons, Death and Extradition Warrants, Reprieves, and related documents. Previously and informally named "Paroles and Pardons", this collection was artificially organized by the Archives in about 1930; additions were made periodically. It was assembled from records created by the Executive, beginning with the Privy Council of the Kingdom; the Executive Council of the Provisional Government and Republic; and the Office of the Governor of the Territory and State of Hawaii, through the Ariyoshi Administration. There are in addition a very few documents which may have been removed from records of other agencies or individuals. The collection is not indexed, however, the Hawaii Paroling Authority holds ledgerbooks which list alphabetically the names of individuals who received pardons from 1900 to 1984. The collection totals 43.4 cubic feet.

Access to records more than 80 years old is unrestricted under HRS §94-7. Access to records less than 80 years old is restricted under HRS §92F-13, disclosure would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of personal privacy, with the following exceptions: a death warrant, an extradition order or a document which grants or attests to a parole, pardon or commutation of sentence.

AGENCY HISTORY

The duties, responsibilities and authority to take certain quasi-judicial actions traditionally have been vested in the Head of State. The Governor is the Chief Executive of the State of Hawaii and the legal successor as Head of State to the King of Hawaii, through, in order, the President of the Provisional Government and Republic of Hawaii and the Governor of the Territory of Hawaii. The Constitution of 1852 granted the King, by and with the consent of the Privy Council, authority to grant pardons and reprieves. The Constitution of 1894 expanded these powers to include commutations of sentence. These powers were confirmed in the Organic Act and in the State Constitution. Other powers have been enumerated and procedures specified in the law over the years. The Penal Code of 1869 required that the Monarch sign them before death warrants could be executed; procedures for commutations of sentence were delineated in the Session Laws of 1888; the requirements and procedures for paroles were codified in 1905. A uniform extradition act was not passed until 1941, although the Governor had been issuing requests for extradition for many years before that.

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In taking these executive actions, the Head of State has always been advised and assisted by other individuals and agencies, according to custom or, in the modern era, as set forth in the law. The first cases were processed by and through the Privy Council, who sought advice from the Attorney General and others prior to requesting a decision from the King. That managerial function subsequently devolved upon the Board of Prison Inspectors, and its successor agencies, who also sought expert advice from the Sheriff and the Prison Warden, for example, before cases were presented to the Governor for his action. The elimination of capital punishment concurrently ended submission of death warrants for the Governor's signature, and the statutory transfer of paroling authority to the Board of Pardons and Paroles in 1968 reduced the Governor's authority over the paroling process to revocation.

### SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

The collection documents several quasi-judicial executive actions, including commutations of sentence, executions and stays thereof, extraditions and arrests, paroles, and pardons. Records include minutes and reports of meetings; petitions and recommendations for or against various acts of clemency; documents granting or denying commutations of sentence, pardons, paroles and restorations of civil rights; arrest and death warrants and reprieves; copies of court documents, including extradition orders and appeals briefs; and incoming and outgoing official and personal correspondence.

Over time, the volume of quasi-judicial actions grew continuously. From a few isolated requests for pardon in the latter part of the 19th Century, the caseload expanded by the mid-20th Century to include literally hundreds of paroles granted by the Governor each year. Periodically, the type of records in the collection changed. For example, records of parole ceased to be included when paroling authority was delegated to a subordinate executive agency. Similarly, form and style of documents vary over time. For example, up to 1929 paroles and recommendations for paroles were prepared on pre-printed forms. From 1930-1944, forms were mimeographed. Beginning in 1945, printed forms appeared once again. Finally, similar material, which properly should have been included in this series was not, and may be found in the files of the various governors of the Territory and State of Hawaii. For example, the records of Governor Carter contain a "Paroles and Pardons" file; the records of Governor Judd contain an "Extraditions" file. No attempt was made to add such material to this series, although inappropriate material discovered in this series during processing was removed and returned to the Governors' records.

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Processing included such routine actions as weeding of duplicates and routing tags, removal of non-archival fasteners, refolding of materials in alkaline folders and removal of the materials from from five-drawer filing cabinets into alkaline cubic-foot boxes. Because the records were accumulated over a long period, many different filing schemes existed within the collection. Processing therefore included some rearrangement to facilitate description and access.

### SERIES DESCRIPTION

203 RECORDS OF QUASI-JUDICIAL EXECUTIVE ACTIONS. 1856-1986. 43.4 cubic feet.

Arrangement is chronological by year and thereunder by type of action. Arrangement within each type of action varies over time. Earlier records are chronological within each type of action each year and then alphabetical if two or more actions bear the same date. Later records are strictly alphabetical within each type of action for a particular year.

A quasi-judicial executive action is one taken by the executive which involves or affects the judicial process. The records document the interaction of the Chief Executive, supporting executive agencies, and individual petitioners in the application for, processing and granting or denying of commutations of sentence, paroles and pardons, as well as executive actions in capital cases and extraditions.

The records include both single documents and informal "case files". These "case files" consist of documents involving an individual which have been assembled into a single package. Their content ranges from petitions and correspondence to copies of court documents, although some types of file have a fairly constant set of "core" documents. For example, parole case files normally contain a "Recommendation for Parole," submitted by the Board of Prison Inspectors (or its successor agencies) to the Governor; a "Narrative" providing a personal history of the prisoner, summarizing his crime, and containing reports from the prosecutor, judge, warden, etc.; a "Recommendation of Warden for Parole" and a "Certificate of Parole" signed by the Governor. Pardon case files normally contain a copy of the Pardon itself, signed by the Governor, a letter of recommendation submitted by the Board of Prison Inspectors (or its successor agencies), a letter from the individual applying for a pardon and a "Statement of Facts" (similar to the "Narrative" contained in a parole package). Sometimes, one individual has more than one "case file". Often, documents which could have been included in cases files are individually filed.
