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### INTRODUCTION

The records of the Lieutenant Governor consist of material created or collected by the Ministers of the Interior prior to Annexation; the Secretaries of Hawaii during the Territorial period, and after Statehood by the Lieutenant Governors, either pursuant to specific constitutional or statutory functions, or in the course of day-to-day administration of the office.

The records are organized into nine sub-groups, of two or more series each, by function. The arrangement evolved as an administrative convenience because the processing of the various sub-groups and series occurred over a period of many years. The records are in various formats, including: boxed paper records; paper records in bound volumes, including oversize (folio) volumes; audio and video tapes; and records on microfilm.

There have been numerous accessions of records in this group, including some for which a receipt is lacking. The first accession for which a receipt is on file came from the Secretary of Hawaii in December, 1906. Additional records are accessioned regularly. A major deaccession occurred ca. 1970 when, concurrent with a transfer of responsibility for the function, certificates of delayed Hawaiian birth were transferred to the Department of Health.

Access to the records is unrestricted except for Change of Name case files, parts of which are disclosable only to the individual concerned or to that person's specifically designated representative (HRS 92F and OIP Op. Ltr. 92-4); and case file extracts in the records of Interstate Compacts, information which if divulged would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of personal privacy.

#### **AGENCY HISTORY**

The Civil Code of the Hawaiian Islands, enacted on May 17, 1859, provided, inter alia, that certain election records were to be forwarded to, and that all laws were to be deposited with, the Minister of the Interior, whose duty was to preserve, and in the case of the laws, promulgate them. By 1897, the duties of the Minister of the Interior relating to elections had been expanded to include appointing and paying election inspectors. These duties were among those transferred to the Secretary of Hawaii when the "Act to Provide a Government for the Territory of Hawaii" (the Organic Act) became law on April 30, 1900. That Act organized the U. S. Territorial government which succeeded the sovereign Hawaiian government. The Organic Act created the office of the Secretary of Hawaii, and assigned to him responsibility for several functions assigned to the executive or Minister of the Interior of the former government. Later, additional functions were assigned to the Secretary of Hawaii.

The office of Secretary of Hawaii was disestablished and replaced by the office of Lieutenant Governor concurrent with Statehood in 1959. The Lieutenant Governor performs duties formerly the responsibility of the Secretary of Hawaii, including recordation of all legislative and gubernatorial acts; certification of state documents; maintenance of the official file of rules and regulations promulgated by state departments; issuance of orders for change of name; administration of certain interstate compacts; issuance of certificates of organization of soil and water conservation districts; and, as Chief Elections Officer, supervision of elections. In addition, at the direction of the Governor, the Lieutenant Governor maintains files which document the organization and functions of the executive branch of state government.

From 1973 to 1995, the Lieutenant Governor supervised elections through an Elections Division. In 1995, the Elections Division was redesignated the Office of Elections, administratively attached to the Office of the Lieutenant Governor, and the function of supervision of elections was assigned to the newly-created position of Chief Elections Officer within the Office of Elections.

In addition to functions assigned by statute, the Lieutenant Governor also performs such other duties as may be assigned by the Governor. These duties include managing special projects intended to address issues of emerging political importance in the public consciousness. The Special Projects (formerly Research) staff within the Lieutenant Governor's Office provides general research, legislative, and staff support for these special projects.

#### SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

This record group contains laws passed by the King and legislature prior to 1860, previously part of the records of the Foreign Office and Executive, election records and session laws collected by the Minister of the Interior from 1860 up to Annexation, materials created or collected by the Secretary of Hawaii during the Territorial period and, after Statehood, by his successor, the Lieutenant Governor of Hawaii.

Records are arranged into nine sub-groups by the function of the office which resulted in their creation or collection: Sub-Group I, Change of Name Records; Sub-Group II, Originals of Executive and Legislative Actions of the Governor; Sub-Group III, Organizational Records of the Executive Branch; Sub-Group IV, Election Records; Sub-Group V, Records of Special Projects; Sub-Group VI, Records of Administratively Attached Boards, Commissions and Committees; Sub-Group VII, Records related to Appointments; Sub-Group VIII, Records of All Other Statutory Functions; and Sub-Group IX, Administrative Files.

The records in these nine sub-groups contain a diverse mix of information, from case files and voter registers containing facts about individual citizens, through decrees, proclamations and executive orders affecting society as a whole, to records which document the organization and rules under which the executive branch of state government functions. At one level, the mere existence of the records provides direct evidence that the members of the legislature and various officials in the executive branch, including the sovereigns, president, governors, members of the Privy Council, tax assessors, election registrars and inspectors, Ministers of the Interior, Secretaries of Hawaii and Lieutenant Governors carried out the statutory functions of their offices. At another level, the content of the records, beyond documenting the framework and functioning of government, provides implicit evidence of the issues confronting the community, explicit documentation of the judgement of the people on those issues, and the actions taken by the government to deal with them.

Several appraisal and processing decisions worthy of note were made. First, some lists of orders and proclamations, created for administrative purposes, were found among the records. They were consolidated and retained with the records for their index value. Second, it was decided, on the basis of both economic and preservation considerations, to discontinue the practice of binding acts, executive orders and proclamations. Third, prior to processing, organizational charts were in several arrangements; they were placed into a single arrangement. Fourth, Governor's administrative directives describing the methods by which agencies were to review or revise their organizational structure were weeded. Fifth, voter registers dated 1911 and later were weeded since they documented a county function and because they duplicated the original records held by the counties. Sixth, correspondence of all types was sampled because the content tended to document numerous instances of similar problems and solutions. Seventh, order was imposed on records of special projects because those records were received with no clear system of arrangement. Eighth, previous processing had created a separate finding aid of the records of the Secretary of Hawaii, which among other things containing five chronological runs of three categories of similar administrative files. These records were incorporated into this finding aid, each administrative category was consolidated into a single chronological run and designated a separate series.

There are strengths in each of the sub-groups of these records. They are best evidence, both of actions affecting society generally, in the Executive and Legislative Actions sub-group, and of actions affecting the rights of individuals, in the Change of Name sub-group and in some of the Executive Orders and Proclamations. The Organizational Records sub-group contains very thorough and detailed information on how the executive branch accommodated changes in agency functions from Statehood to the present. The Project Files provide evidence of the role of the

Office of the Lieutenant Governor in responding to problems in the forefront of public opinion. Finally, many of the records, and particularly those in the Election Records sub-group, are potentially valuable as sources of data for a variety of research purposes.

There are two weaknesses in this record group: missing individual records, and gaps in the records. In some sub-groups, most of the missing records and gaps occur in early 19th century records. After 1862, only a very few items were noted to be missing: one Executive Order setting aside land for public purposes; four Executive Orders, general; some index cards for Change of Name records; and some gubernatorial Proclamations establishing forest reserves - of which signed duplicates may be found in the records of the Governor filed under: "Territorial Departments, Board of Agriculture and Forestry, Forest Reserves"). More detailed information, including citation of exceptions, may be found in the sub-group descriptions. In other sub-groups, the gaps occur later. The administrative correspondence files contain many gaps, but in particular there are very few records from the 1960 or later. On particular gap was created through the reassignment of the function to record delayed Hawaiian births from the Lieutenant Governor to the Department of Health, which occasioned transfer of the files of delayed Hawaiian birth certificates to the Department of Health ca. 1970.

Related records are contained in other record groups. Laws, rules and regulations issued during the period of the Hawaiian Kingdom without having been passed - or ratified after the fact - by the legislature may be found in the records of the Department of the Interior, Island Governors, and Foreign Office and Executive. Correspondence related to the administration of elections from 1846 to 1898 is contained in the records of the Department of the Interior. Information used in the compilation of voter registers and pollbooks may be found in the records of the Department of Taxation.

### SUB-GROUP I

### CHANGE OF NAME RECORDS

Organized into two series: Series 199, Register of Petitions for Change of Name; and Series 202, Change of Name Case Files.

Consists of records created or collected by the Secretary of Hawaii and, after statehood, by his successor, the Lieutenant Governor, in carrying out his statutory duties related to the administration of requests for change of name.

Authority to grant changes of name originally rested with the King. This authority passed, in succession, to the President of the Provisional Government, the President of the Republic and the Governor of the Territory before it was delegated to the Secretary of Hawaii in 1953.

There are only two change of name records prior to 1910.

Physical Characteristics/Condition: Consists of manuscript entries in ruled columnar ledgers, in good condition.

Content Description: Contains an approximately chronological record of change of name actions. The register was originated by the Secretary of Hawaii when the authority to grant changes of name was delegated to that official. Concurrently, the practice of assigning numbers to petitions (case files) was begun. An entry in the register includes the file number, name(s) of petitioner(s), date petition received, date change of name issued, date published, and date of affidavit.

Arrangement: Numerical by case file number. Volume 1 contains case files 1-16774 and volume 2 contains case files 16775-35853.

Notes:

The registers may be considered to be a chronological index to change of name cases in Series 202, supplementary to the alphabetical indexes in Series 200 and act.

Physical Characteristics/Condition: Consists of typescript and manuscript paper record in good condition.

Content Description: Contains case files. Each file normally includes the petition and the decree or order for change of name, and the affidavit of publication. The petition includes a variety of information about the petitioner or the person(s) on whose behalf the petition is submitted, such as address, ancestry, citizenship, residence, birth place, birth date, parents' names, military service, criminal history, and marital status if any, and the name of the attorney who prepared it. The decree or order for change of name includes the date of change of name, the present and former names, and the name of the newspaper which published the announcement of the change of name. The affidavit of publication includes a newsprint copy of the notice of change of name and the date of publication. Documents name changes, as authorized by Act 30, 1872, and granted by decree or order of the Governor (1900 - 1953), the Secretary of Hawaii (1953 - 1959) and the Lieutenant Governor (1959-), upon petition by individual(s) or parents or guardians of and on behalf of minor children. This series includes one file of change of name issued by the King in 1874. The information in the case files is useful in genealogical research, but available only to petitioners.

**Arrangement**: Arranged chronologically; from June 18, 1953, also in numerical order by case file number.

Notes:

Case files numbered 36175 and 37101 were not accessioned; numbers 38070

through 38669 were not used, and number 43418 was not transferred.

Unrestricted, except that petitions are disclosable only to the individual concerned

or to that person's designated representative (HRS 92F, OIP Op. Ltr. 92-4).

Organized into five series by type of record: Series 263, Originals of Legislative Actions of the Governor; Series 264, Originals of Hawaii Defense Act Rules; Series 265, Originals of Gubernatorial Executive Orders Setting Aside Land for Public Purposes; Series 266, Originals of Gubernatorial Executive Orders dealing with Subjects other than Land; and Series 267, Originals of Gubernatorial Proclamations.

Contains laws passed by the King and legislature prior to 1860; session laws collected by the Minister of the Interior from 1860 up to Annexation in fulfilling their duty to receive, preserve and promulgate all acts of the legislature; and after Annexation, of records created or collected by the Secretaries of Hawaii during the Territorial period and, after statehood, by their successors, the Lieutenant Governors of Hawaii, in fulfilling the statutory function of their office to accomplish the recordation of all legislative and executive gubernatorial acts.

Prior to 1845, few of the original acts exist in their final form, although for some, draft versions with the King's signature were found during processing and were retained. Only seven of 40 acts for 1852 were found during processing. Notes in the files reflect that six of those have been returned to the Archives from private sources since ca. 1960; the other was located among the legislative records. Five more acts for 1852 were purchased on the open market by a private collector and given to the Archives in October, 1996. Thus, one entire year's worth of acts somehow, at some time in the past, were alienated from the rest of the records and most remain missing today.

- 4. The weakness of this series is several pre-1860 acts which are missing from the files.
- 5. Acts passed by the King in council, but not by the legislature, and acts predating the Constitution of 1840 but not re-issued in the session laws of 1842, remain part of the records of the Foreign Office and Executive.
- 6. In sub-series 1, 47 of the 49 volumes and most of the boxed acts and joint resolutions are in both English and Hawaiian.
- 7. Some vetoed bills, returned to the legislature, may be found among the legislative records.

- 1. Some bound volumes were designated by "book" numbers in the original filing scheme. Some foldered oaths were also assigned "Book" and page numbers, and although they were not bound, they follow the same numbering scheme as the volumes.

Some such forms have typed pages glued atop them. Many records have been bound into volumes; many others are loose records, foldered and boxed. All volumes have indices; some are in separate softcover volumes. In such cases, the indices have been assigned separate volume numbers. Some early records are acidified and embrittled, but most are in good condition. The spine of one volume is separating and is secured with twill tape.

Content Description: Contains file copies [referred to as "duplicates"] of appointments [sometimes referred to as "commissions"]; logs of appointments; lists of boards, committees and commissions; and samples of housekeeping letters used to manage the appointment process. Most records in this series were received by the Secretary of Hawaii or Lieutenant Governor from the Governor's office. Volumes are indexed alphabetically by the name of the person appointed. Documents part of the process of securing appointees for the many patronage positions within the executive branch of territorial and state government. Illustrates the role of the Lieutenant Governor in recording various official actions of the Governor. Each appointment includes name of person appointed, position to which appointed, date of appointment and date appointment expires. Appointment or appointment log will also sometimes include annotations about resignation, senate confirmation or reappointment of incumbent. The records as received indicate that they deal with appointments to "boards and commissions," but in fact they more than that, e.g., they include appointments of executive department heads, circuit court judges, etc. Names of appointees provide insights into local politics.

Arrangement: Organized into two sub-series: 1. Duplicate Appointments and 2. Management Files. Thereunder, the duplicate appointments are generally arranged numerically. The management files are arranged by record type, viz., revocation of appointment; appointment logs; lists of boards, committees and commissions; and samples of correspondence. Within record types, arrangement is chronological.

Arrangement: Numerical by volume number. Volumes are numbered in chronological order.

Notes:

- 1. This series consists of records previously processed in a separate Secretary of Hawaii records group, which has been eliminated and its records integrated into the Lieutenant Governor record group.
- 2. Reports for 1900-1904 and 1953-1959 are lacking.
- 3. The volumes include tables of contents (called "indexes") created in the Archives.

Contains records created or collected in the Office of the Secretary of Hawaii or his successor, the Lieutenant Governor, as a result of day-to-day administrative requirements unrelated to a specific statutory mandate. Includes rules and sampled notices and correspondence concerning issuance of delayed Hawaiian birth certificates. The certificates themselves and related evidence, e.g., transcripts of testimony, were transferred to the Department of Health ca. 1970, following transfer of responsibility for the function from the Lieutenant Governor to the Department of Health by Act 11, 1970. No receipt from the Department of Health documenting the transfer has been located.

Because of the subjectivity of the records as well as inconsistencies in filing practices over time, series 390, 391 and 392 are more than merely mutually complementary. Series 392 contains documents from, e.g., Hawaii government agencies, which one would expect to be in Series 390 or foreign consulates, nominally part of Series 391. Documents dealing with seemingly significant subjects are often filed under the name of the originator rather than by subject. Documents of the same subject are sometimes filed separately by that subject in one era but are interfiled in the General alphabetical files in another. Consequently, thorough research will require more than ordinary imagination and diligence.

Records in the Legislature sub-series deal mostly with the role of the Secretary of Hawaii as a special disbursing agent for federal funds allocated to the Territorial Legislature. Records in the County Governments sub-series deal mostly with planning for and conduct of elections. Also includes final reports of many of the consulates of the Republic of Hawaii, reports of transfer of land titles, and material related to controversies and disagreements over policies and personalities.

Arrangement: Organized into four sub-series: 1. Executive Agencies; 2. the Legislature; 3. the Judiciary; and 4. County Governments. The Executive Agencies are arranged alphabetically by agency name and thereunder chronologically; however, there are inconsistencies in the details. Sometimes records of a predecessor agency are included in the files of the successor agency; sometimes predecessor and successor agency records are filed separately. Sometimes records of a subordinate agency are included in the files of the senior agency; sometimes each agency has its own file. The Judiciary and the Legislature are arranged chronologically. The County Governments are arranged with the City and County of Honolulu first, followed by the other three counties in alphabetical order, and thereunder chronologically.

Notes:

- 1. Series was created by merging records previously processed in a Secretary of Hawaii records group with records received from the successor agency, the Office of the Lieutenant Governor. Concurrently, the separate Secretary of Hawaii records group was eliminated.
- 2. Records were weeded per the General Records Schedules of the State of Hawaii. This resulted in removal of non-permanent materials such as most personnel records, including resumes of job-seekers; financial records such as cash

Includes some published materials. Documents the issues with which the office became involved, such as providing information and assistance to individuals on subjects as diverse as immigration, issuance of passports, delayed recording of Hawaiian births, processing claims against the Chinese fund, and assisting in the expatriation of Japanese-Americans; preparing for elections; overseeing the planning and execution of Hawaii's participation in the Panama Pacific Exposition, the Paris Overseas and Colonial Exposition and the Chicago World's Fair; and dealing with requests for bids and for appointment to public office. The types of action taken show how those issues were managed. The change in focus of the office is reflected in the variation of issues over time. In addition, the records en passant include material which provides insights into the attitudes, customs and usage of, usually, the politically predominant culture in Hawaii, and their evolution during the date span of the records.

Arrangement: Alphabetical by file folder title. Within file folders, records are generally in reverse chronological order.

Other letters hint at the plethora of issues with which the office became involved, for example, the sale of public land, house numbering in Honolulu and prostitution in Iwilei, and how those issues were managed.
