

THE BOARD OF HARBOR COMMISSIONERS

INTRODUCTION

The records created by the Board of Harbor Commissioners span the years 1911-1949 and include documents created by the Superintendent of Public Works, the Board of Harbor Commissioners, and the Honolulu Harbormaster. These records reflect the various functions, which were: the control and management of shores, harbors, waterfront improvements, wharves, docks, etc. belonging to the Territory of Hawaii; the regulation of shipping of passengers and cargo; the maintenance of harbor facilities; and the administration of the harbors. Earlier records of the Collector General of Customs are included when they reflect functions that were carried on after 1911 by the Board of Harbor Commissioners.

As the records of the Board of Harbor Commissioners document only duties and activities of harbors under territorial jurisdiction, none of the records of the bombing of Pearl Harbor may be found in this record group.

Related 19th century records may be found in the Collector General of Customs. Printed reports are filed in the Government Publications Collection.

AGENCY HISTORY

Originally, records of shipping and harbor affairs, dating from 1842, were kept by the Harbormaster under the Ministry of the Interior, and later by the Collector General of Customs under the Ministry of Finance. With the establishment of the Territory through the Organic Act of 1900, the duties relating to "streets and highways, harbor improvements, wharves, landings, waterworks, etc." passed to the Superintendent of Public Works.

On July 1, 1911, Act 163 transferred all the functions of the Superintendent of Public Works dealing with the ports and harbors to an independent Board of Harbor Commissioners "to control and manage the harbors, ports, docks, wharves and shipping throughout the Territory." It consisted of five members, the Chairman (who acted as Chief Engineer) being the Superintendent of Public Works, and the other four appointed by the governor. In 1951, Act 22 amended this to seven members, the Chairman again being the Superintendent of Public works.

The duties of the Board included the following:

1. Appointment and removal of harbormasters, pilots, pilot boat crews and clerks, as well as setting of their compensation.
2. Supervision, planning and design of construction and maintenance of wharves, piers, buildings, and (dredging of) harbors; drawing up of contracts for labor; and overseeing the execution of that labor.
3. Setting and collection of charges for services of wharfage, pilotage, towage, storage of freight in warehouses and harbormaster's fees.
4. Ensuring the safety and cleanliness of Territorial harbors by providing lighthouse service, harbor police, lifeguard beach patrol and oil pipelines.

When Hawaii attained statehood in 1959, the resultant reordering of the government placed the Board of Harbor Commissioners under the Department of Transportation. The composition of the Board remained the same with the exception that the Director of Transportation then became its Chairman.

On July 1, 1961, the Board of Harbor Commissioners was abolished and in its place the Department of Transportation organized a Commission on Transportation, consisting originally of nine members and later eleven members, to advise the Director of Transportation on pertinent matters.

- 98 **MINUTES OF MEETINGS OF THE BOARD OF HARBOR COMMISSIONERS. 1911-1961.**
50 volumes, 5.67 linear feet.
Arranged chronologically by fiscal year.
Contains the minutes of regular meetings and occasional special meetings of the Board. Included are decisions for the authorization of repairs and payment of bills, awarding of contracts and building permits, purchase of land and materials, granting of permission to use piers or waterways for sporting, fund-raising or celebratory events, setting and changing of fees for use of harbor facilities, etc.
- 99 **CORRESPONDENCE OF THE BOARD OF HARBOR COMMISSIONERS. 1915-1918; 1920-1934; 1936-1945; 1948.**
7 cubic feet; folder files.
Arranged chronologically by fiscal year and alphabetically by name, office, or company thereunder.
Correspondence consists of letters exchanged by Chairman of the Board and his clerk with Honolulu and outer island harbormasters, various shipping and engineering firms, Office of the Attorney General, Corps of Engineers, Commissioner of Public Lands, Chamber of Commerce, Office of the Governor, Board of Health, American Association of Port Authorities, etc.
As the responsibility for the safety and cleanliness of the waterways of the Territory fell under the authority of the Board of Harbor Commissioners, correspondence entitled "Lighthouse Service," "Waikiki Beach Patrol" and "Oil Pipelines" are filed within this series.

The 1942-1948 folders found at the end of this series contain negotiations with the Army and Navy concerning back payment for the use of harbor facilities and pilotage services during WWII. The actual annual correspondence, however, concludes in 1945. THERE ARE NO RECORDS OF THE BOMBING OF PEARL HARBOR or any whatsoever for 1941-1942.

Maps from 1934-1936 and 1939 of Hawaiian harbors (all islands) are filed in the Map Collection (See "Cartographic Checklist").

- 100 **WAIKIKI PROJECT FILES.** 1919-1921; 1929-1930; 1937-1939; 1948-1949. 4 lin. inches; folder files.
Arranged chronologically.
Working papers of beach reclamation, dredging and improvement projects for Waikiki beaches. Comprised of blueprints, estimates, notes and tabulations, weekly reports, permits, proposals, and plans and specifications for construction. Includes a scroll of cross-sections of Waikiki beaches for 1929-1930.
- 101 **CARGO STATISTICS.** 1931-1933; 1941-1942. 1/2 lin. inch; 1 vol.
Arranged chronologically by month.
Lists type and value of cargo entries and clearances for Ports of Kahului and Nawiliwili. Vessels are separated into interisland and mainland categories. Included in back are accounts of war emergency expenses by island, from Dec. 7, 1941-July 1942.
- 102 **ALOHA TOWER VISITORS BOOK.** June 1927-March 1929. 1 lin. inch; 1 vol.
Arranged chronologically by date of visit.
The management and maintenance of Aloha Tower fell under the aegis of the Board of Harbor Commissioners. This one example remains to reflect that function, and is composed of the names, hometown addresses, and very interesting remarks of visitors to Aloha Tower.
- 103 **CORRESPONDENCE OF THE HONOLULU HARBORMASTER.** 1919-1920; 1922-1931; 1937-1944. 5 1/2 lin. inches; folder files.
Arranged alphabetically by subject and chronologically thereunder.
Consists mostly of letters, reports and personnel information from the Honolulu Harbormaster to the Chairman of the Board or the Administrative Officer. Also contains Report and Minutes of the Maritime Affairs Committee and the Seamen's Institute, statements on quarantine inspection (entitled "Public Health Service"), oil spills and Harbor Police accident reports. THERE IS NO INFORMATION PERTAINING TO THE BOMBING OF PEARL HARBOR.
- 104 **REGISTERS OF ENTRIES AND CLEARANCES.** Oct. 21, 1842-Dec. 6, 1941. 19 lin. inches; 15 vols. and 6 folders.
Arranged chronologically.
Records of cargo-carrying vessels in Honolulu Harbor; includes ship name, tonnage, wharfage, date of arrival and departure, where from, destination, and type of cargo. Various called "Port of Honolulu - Arrivals and Departures" and "Entries and Clearances".
Also included are the Journal of William Paty, Harbormaster and first Collector General, from Jan. 1842-Jan. 1845 (in the 1842-1849 volume); and the correspondence of Capt. A. Fuller, agent for the Bureau Veritas, from 1882-1884 (in the 1881-1894 volume). There are no records for 1865-1867.

- 105 **PILOTAGE RECORDS.** 1877-1929. 8 lin. feet; 70 vols.
Arranged chronologically by month.
Contains name of vessel, captain, dates of arrival and departure, where from, nationality, tonnage, draft, weather at time of arrival, pilot's name and remarks. Variouslly called "Inward and Outward Pilotage Records" (1877-1913), "Pilot's Reports" (1900-1915), and "Pilot's Log" (1915-1929). The records from 1877-1913 are much less detailed than later ones.
- 106 **RECORDS OF MARINE NOTE OF PROTEST.** 1901-1920. 11 lin. inches; 9 vols.
Arranged chronologically.
Notarized declarations of "boisterous weather" or other mishaps encountered at sea, declared by the ship's captain upon arrival at the Port of Honolulu. Includes name of vessel, captain and date of arrival. Few give detailed accounts of damage done to ship or cargo and the storms or accidents which caused it.
- 107 **RECORD OF MARINE ACCIDENTS.** 1912-1924. 1 lin. inch; 1 vol.
Arranged chronologically.
Mostly narrative entries by the Honolulu Harbormaster of damage done to/by ships, piers or harbor (such as oil spills) while at wharf. Also contains a brief "List of Wrecks and Collisions".
- 108 **RECORD OF FREIGHT AND PASSENGERS.** 1933-1943. 3 lin. inches; 3 vols.
Arranged chronologically by month.
Gives name of vessel, date of entry and clearance, number of passengers (no names), type and tonnage of freight. Port of Honolulu only.
- 109 **FISHING BOAT RECORDS.** 1916-1929; 1937. 3 lin. inches; 3 vols.
Arranged chronologically.
Registration books of fishing boats, pleasure craft and sampans. Include names of owners, date and number of registration, length of boats and pier location. "Mooring Fees" includes the monthly fee paid by each boat. "Registry of Fishing and Pleasure Boats" contains the 1929 Registry of Sampan owners as well (in back). The "Sampan Daily Report" identifies the daily catch of fish in pounds, supplies used, and time of arrival and departure of each sampan.
- 110 **BOOKKEEPING RECORDS.** 1913-1915; 1923-1927; 1941-1942. 4 1/2 lin. inches; 3 vols.
Arranged in 2 sub-series: 1) Cash Book, and 2) Daily Record of Fees, and chronologically thereunder.
Documents name of vessel, amount paid for wharfage, pilotage, harbormaster's fees, demurrage and oil, and date and receipt number of transaction. The Cash Book contains records mostly from Honolulu Harbor, but also includes some information for Hilo, Kahului and Port Allen.
The 1941-1942 Daily Record of Fees gives dates of entries and clearances in addition to the accounts.
