History of Liliuokalani Gardens.

The property immediately surrounding Waikahalulu Falls in Nuuanu Street belonged to ex-Queen Liliuokalani when the first suggestion was made, by Alexander Hume Ford in 1907/1908, that this area between School and Kuakini Streets be made into a public park. The first plan was that it was to be developed into an International botanic garden, sponsored by the Pan Pacific Union, with support of the Civic Federation of Hawaii.

Surrounding parcels of land were acquiared with funds raised by the Civic Federation but the original plan was not feasible, even after Queen Liliuokalani gave her property there to the project, so the area was turned over to the City and County of Honolulu to be improved and developed as a park.

MAYME L. CORBETT, ca. 1880-1967

INTRODUCTION

The Mayme L. Corbett Diary is a record of slightly more than one year in the life of an island resident who was trapped on the Mainland by the Japanese attack on Pearl Harbor. It was given to the Archives in 1981 by her daughter-in-law, Mrs. Gerald R. Corbett. It measures 0.5 linear inch.

BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH

Mayme Louise Corbett was the wife of John Arthur Corbett, the General Manager of Love's Bakery in Honolulu. Born Mary (Mayme) Louise McGree, in Quebec, ca. 1880, she married Corbett on September 24, 1902, in Stevens Point, Wisconsin. They had four children, one of whom, Gerald R., was active in politics and government in Honolulu. John Corbett was a business executive on the Mainland with experience in managing biscuit companies before moving to Hawaii in 1928 to take charge of Love's Biscuit and Bread Company. He died in Hawaii in 1952; she died on April 4, 1967, in St. Francis Hospital.

SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

The diary covers the period from December 7, 1941 to January 12, 1943. It discusses mostly personal, domestic matters, but it also alludes to World War II events, such as the Battle of Midway. It includes descriptions of Mayme Corbett's life in California, her efforts, finally successful in October, 1942, to return home, and her adjustments to the inconveniences of life in Hawaii under military government. The diary is most useful because it provides an unusual perspective of the events of 1942, and how some of the people caught up in those events coped with the changes they wrought.
