1859	September 11, shot by Kamehameha IV, at Lahaina
1862	February 12, died in Honolulu

1909	Born May 27, Portland Educated in Portland and Los Angeles; worked in Los Angeles as accountant
1937	November, came to Hawaii as accountant for Von Hamm-Young Company
1946	January, first conceived idea of Aloha Week
1947-48	President of Aloha Week organization and honorary life chairman; known as Father of Aloha Week
