Dear Sir:

In accordance with your request of June 2nd, relative to a right of way to lay a track from the northern boundary of its station lot situate at the foot of Waialuenu Street, Hilo, across the northern end of Front Street to and up Wailuku Street to Bridge Street, I beg to inform you that this right of way, conforming to the following description, has been approved by the Governor and myself.

Beginning at the northwest boundary of the Hilo Railroad's Company's Depot Lot in the Town of Hilo at a point distant North $50^{\circ} 56'$ East 6 feet from the West corner of said Lot; thence to and along Wailuku Street Westerly and curving to the left with radius 191 feet 242.7 feet, the direct course being North $86^{\circ} 48'$ West 226.1 feet; thence parallel to and 13 feet northwesterly from the southeasterly line of Wailuku Street to Bridge Street.
